

GASHKENDAMIDE'E (BE GRIEVED FROM THE HEART)



Dilico staff along with community members from Red Rock Indian Band participated in our Gashkendamide'e (Be grieved from the heart) train the trainer program in December. "It was a two day Indigenous led group that aims to empower and support individuals in their grief journey through the sharing of stories, understanding grief and its effects on us physically, emotionally, spiritually and socially."



Transdiagnostic Group Treatment for Adolescents

A new mental health summer camp was offered to a small group of youth during the 2023 summer. The group was part of a research collaboration with Dr. Christopher Mushquash and Kristy Kowatch at Lakehead University. The group brought together evidence-based psychology strategies and cultural interventions to improve mental health among a group of youth aged 7 to 11 years.

To open each group, members of the cultural knowledge team lead a smudging ceremony and talking circle to help settle the youth into the group environment. Throughout the week, youth had the opportunity to learn how to identify emotions, what the function of emotions are, as well as some strategies to help them cope when their emotions feel too big or out of control.

To increase mental wellness the cultural team provided teachings about self-love, sticking with things when they get difficult, the Medicine Wheel, the 7 Grandfather Teachings, and flute playing. The youth also observed and participated in dancing and drumming demonstrations. These cultural interventions were complimented by psychology based skills of acting the opposite when feeling unhelpful emotions and mindfulness to be intentional about emotional experiences.

The camp also included fun activities like board games, crafts, and sports multiple times each day. Each group ended with a gratitude circle to talk about what they learned or appreciated in the group, followed by a smudging ceremony.


All of the youth reported that they had fun and enjoyed connecting with other kids in the group. The youth enjoyed the cultural teachings and learning new skills.

There are plans to explore how this group could be offered in a once-perweek format.
